





THE car was bought by a forestry officer, J. B. Cameron, in Bairnsdale and registered in January 1940. He died at the wheel after parking it in his garage. My grandfather bought the car in 1945 and brought it to Melbourne.


The car was used to tow a caravan that was built by my grandfather. In the early days chains were not a requirement and on one occasion he said he was driving out in the country and happened to look in the rear vision mirror and realised that there was no caravan following him. So he did a u-turn and went back and found the van in a paddock. He promptly hooked it back onto the towbar and continued on the trip.

The last time I travelled in the car I was about 6 years of age, (I'm now 60). I remember my grandfather driving and my older brother and I



were standing behind the front seat – so that we could see where we were going. The car was always garaged and in its later years of life (1960's), it was rarely used, because it was always difficult to start. All up, the car has done 110,000 miles.

After my grandparents died 30 years ago, their property was sold and my father and his brothers wanted to either take the car to the wreckers for scrap or leave it in the garage and let the new purchasers worry about disposing of it. They chose the latter however, so I asked if I could take the car. Not knowing much about cars, I went to Richmond Tech

and did an automotive machining hobby course and also a spray painting course. I took the motor into the Tech and working on it one night per week, it took 2 ½ years to recondition. The spray painting course continued for 3 years while I took panels and doors etc. in there to prepare and paint. I worked on the car for about 3 years until we "moved house" when the car was put on hold for about 14 years. The project was restarted from scratch again 7 years ago and in March 2009 the car should be on the road, with the help of Eric Crombie, Con Papas and more recently Alan Summergreene.

The Deluxe is in good company at Alan Summergreene's workshop.





SATURDAY 3 January – Farewell breakfast at a minimal cost . . . we were rather sad to leave!



Next we drove to Queenstown for another three night stay amongst the unbelievable scenery of lakes, waterways and snow peaked mountains.


